



# Timelines For application of UK SPS Controls



## 1 July 2022

- **Pre-notification** of food imports (all products) from Ireland to Britain on IPAFFS for Animal Products or PEACHES for Plant Products.
- **Full CHED** equivalent information required for IPAFFS notification.
- **24 hours in advance** unless shorter period agreed by importer with local Port Health Authority responsible for Border Control Post.
- All exports to GB of Products of Animal Origin and plant products must **enter UK entry point with a designated Border Control Post.**
- **Export Health Certification** required for Meat, Meat Products and Animal By-products and **Phytosanitary certificate** required for plant products.
- **BCP Physical and ID Controls** will apply to Meat, Meat Products and Animal By-products.
- Loads/consignments **selected for BCP Physical/ID controls will be notified to importer via IPAFFS** at least 2 hours in advance of arrival in Britain.
- Exports of Chilled Meat preparations to Britain will be prohibited.

# Timelines For application of UK SPS Controls



## 1 September 2022

- **Export Health Certification** required for Dairy Products.
- **BCP Physical and ID Controls** will apply to Dairy Products.
- Loads/consignments **selected for Physical/ID controls will be notified to importer via IPAFFS** at least 2 hours in advance of arrival in Britain.

## 1 November 2022

- **Export Health Certification** required for Fish, Composite Products, Table Eggs, Honey.
- **BCP Physical and ID Controls** will apply to Fish, Composite Products, Table Eggs, Honey.
- Loads/consignments **selected for BCP Physical/ID controls will be notified to importer via IPAFFS** at least 2 hours in advance of arrival in Britain.

# Key Messages to Exporting Food Businesses



- Familiarise yourself with Irish and UK Customs and SPS export requirements.
- Identify the right certificate(s) for your products.
- Examine your supply chain and ensure that you know who is responsible for meeting each import requirement correctly - pre-notification, export certification applications, supporting documentation for export certification (traceability of inputs, etc).
- Make sure your business is familiar with the EU TRACES system - register as required, have staff attend training events, and be familiar with the application process.
- **ENGAGE** directly with your local DAFM Supervisory team to ensure that export health certification requirements can be met, and that the business processes in place are aligned with resources available to meet these requirements.

# BAR Eligibility



- Indicative but not exhaustive list of measures eligible for funding:
  - *to adversely affected private and public **businesses**;*
  - *to the most adversely affected economic **sectors**;*
  - *to businesses, regional and local communities and organisations **dependent on fishing activities** in UK and relevant waters;*
  - ***for job creation and protection**;*
  - *to ensure the functioning of border, customs, sanitary and phytosanitary, security and fisheries **controls, and** the collection of indirect taxation;*
  - *to facilitate regimes for **certification and authorisation** of products;*
  - ***for communication**, information and awareness-raising of citizens and businesses; and*
  - *for the **re-integration of EU citizens** who left the UK as a result of the withdrawal.*
- The **eligibility period** for expenditure runs from **1 January 2020 to 31 December 2023**. All expenditure must be incurred by 31 December 2023.

# BAR Requirements



- Expenditure under the Reserve must demonstrate **a direct link to a negative impact of the withdrawal of the UK from the EU.**
- Measures proposed for support must have the objective of addressing **the direct negative Brexit impact identified.**
- BAR Expenditure must also meet other **EU funding requirements**, including management and control, audit, **state aid rules** and public procurement requirements.

# UK Trade Policy Post Brexit



- UK has rolled over EU-3<sup>rd</sup> country Free Trade Agreements covering trade with almost 70 Countries.
- UK has agreed New FTAs to date
  - *Australia (political agreement in principle – Feb 2021, signed full agreement Jun 2021, ratification ongoing)*
  - *New Zealand (political agreement in principle – Oct 2021, signed full agreement Feb 2022, ratification ongoing)*
- UK is engaged in new Trade negotiations with:
  - *India*
  - *Canada*
- UK has also applied to join CPTPP (Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership)

# New UK – 3<sup>rd</sup> Country Agreements – Agri-Food outcomes



## **Market Access**

UK-Australia and UK-New Zealand FTAs provide for full tariff-free and quota-free access to UK for over 95% of tariff lines from day one of implementation.

## **SPS Import Standards**

Agreements provide for ‘independent SPS Regimes’ while also opening the door for equivalence of SPS being achieved in specific product areas. No new provisions which would change current UK standards requirements in areas such as hormone beef for example.

## **Animal Welfare**

Chapters in FTA - new departure for Aus and NZ. Provide for collaboration and that high animal welfare standards on both sides should not be weakened, while also not impacting trade.
