Written for teachers this book sets out a series of 48 species which should be taught to primary school pupils - 6 for each year. This breaks down to 2 wildflowers, 1 tree, 1 bird, 1 mammal and 1 creepy crawlly. The teachers adopt this book at the year's school planning meeting and each year then teach the species recommended for each particular year. Thus, the pupil's knowledge builds up year on year and each teacher knows what has been taught to the child in the years previous. The book contains all the information the teachers need about each species together with suggested activities for each species.

Funding

Community Environment Action Fund

| This used to be called Local Agenda 21. It is organised by the Department of Environment, Climate and Communications annually. Funds are distributed to local authorities to subsidise local environmental initiatives. These include school gardens.

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| Organised by the Department of Rural and Community Development. Funding is provided annually for small scale infrastructural projects in rural areas.

Local authorities

| Funding available for local environmental projects.

Some local businesses

| Community funds to support school gardens.

Parents

| Often willing to provide funding and practical help in setting up and maintaining a school garden.

Plant sales and raffles in schools on an annual Open Day

| Will generate funds for school gardening. Plants could be donated by parents and grandparents. Some schools raise the plants for sale themselves. Pelargoniums and other bedding plants always sell well. These can be bought cheaply as small plugs in early spring and cared for by different classes.

The Creative Schools Programme

| Funds creativity in schools which includes outdoor learning spaces.

Local Tidy Towns group

| Often help towards the funding of school gardens.
