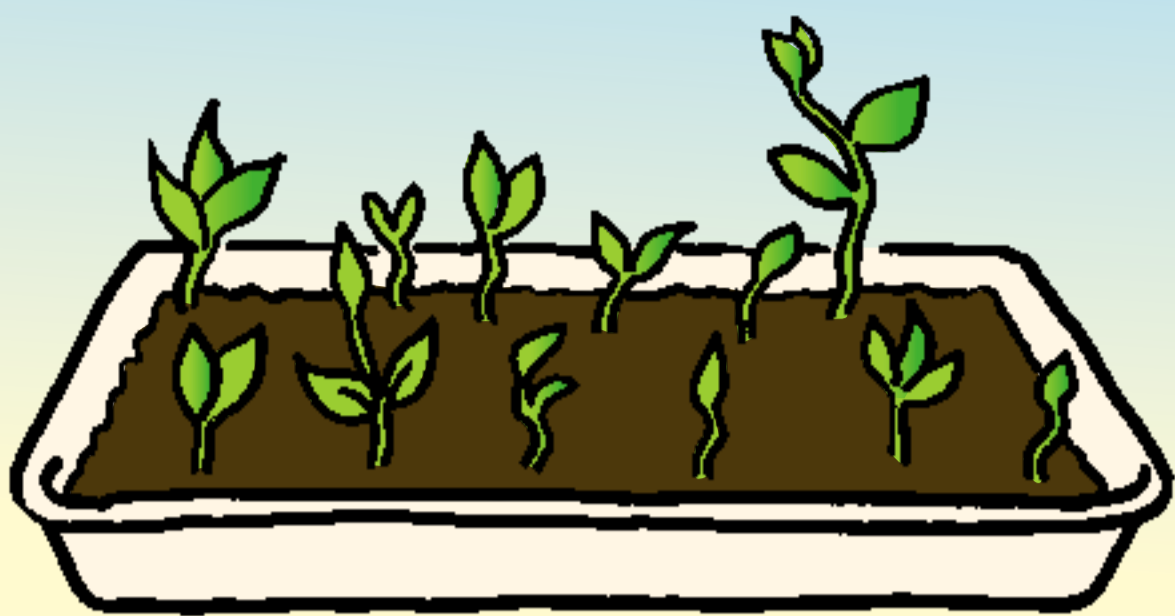


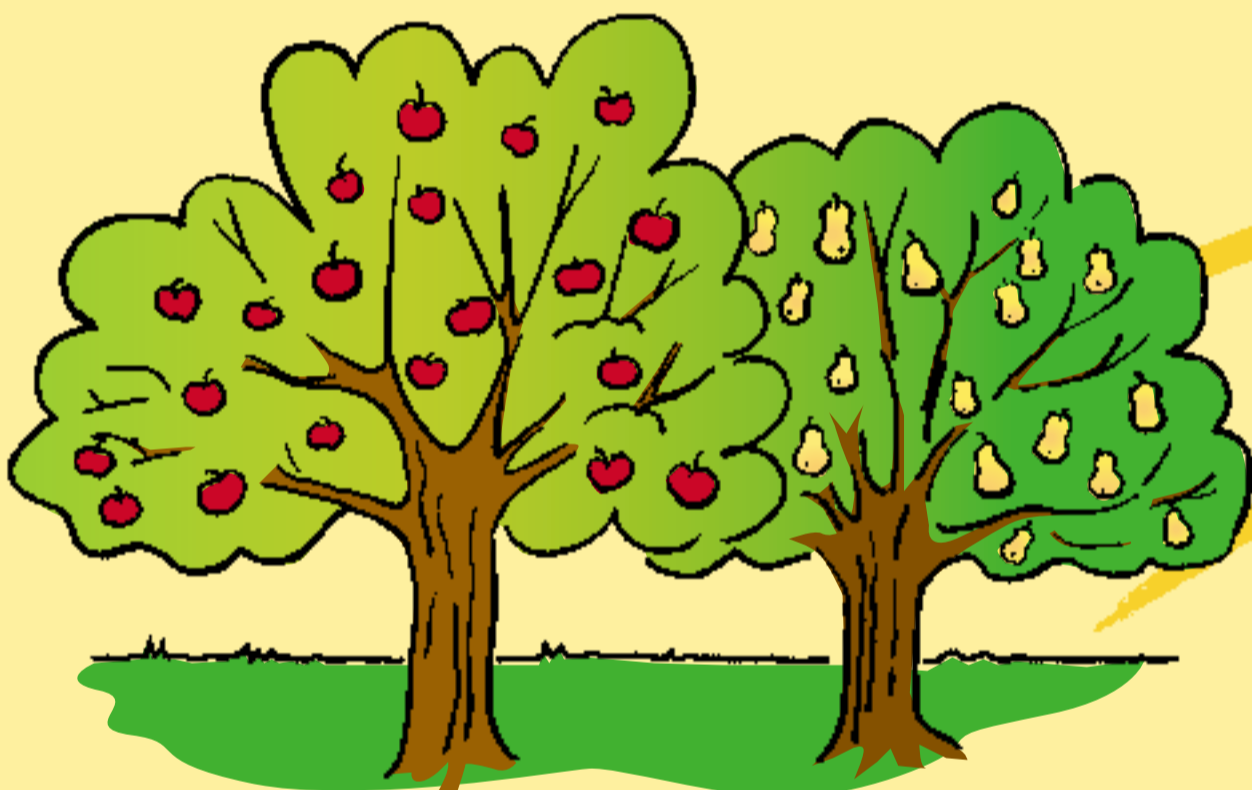
The Sun and the Seasons



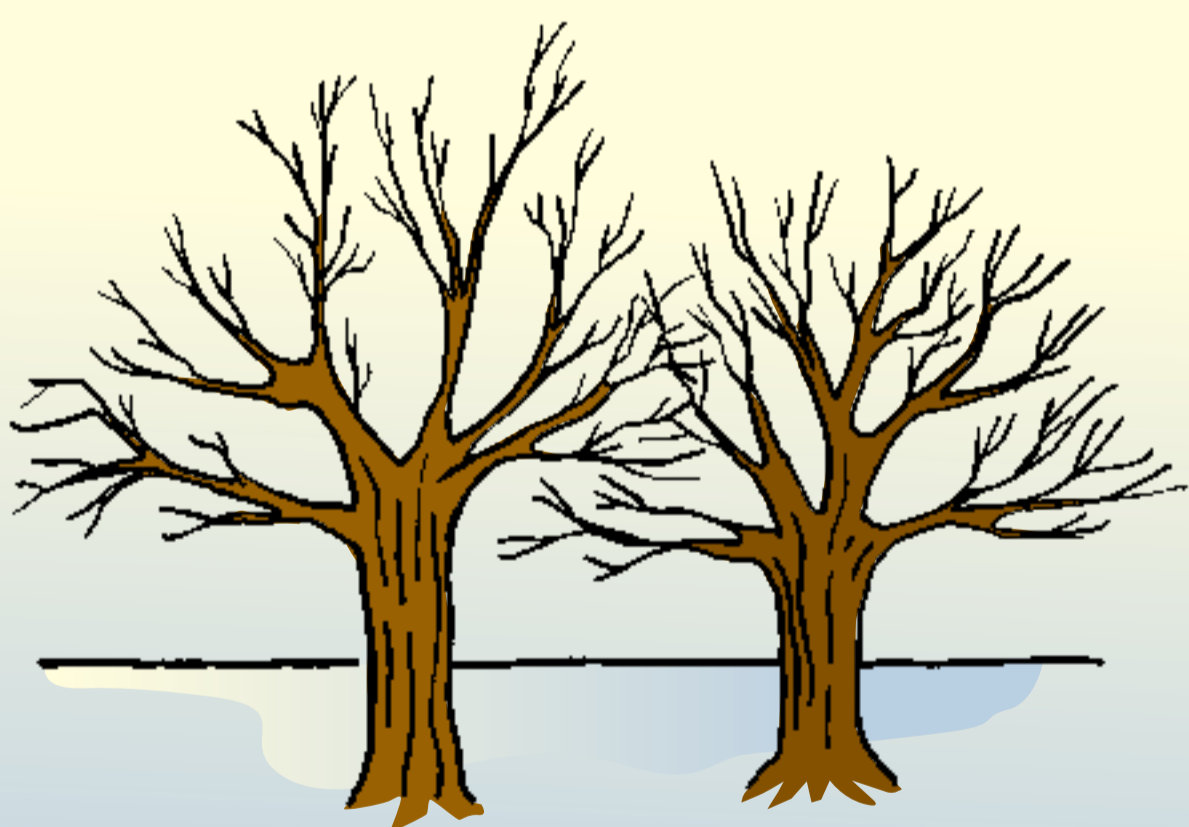
In **Spring** baby veg in their vegetable plots
